New budget billing options available for members

Kenergy is excited to now offer two new budget billing options: Levelized Budget Billing and Fixed Budget Billing. These new options will allow members to budget their monthly energy expenses more consistently and help level out fluctuating energy costs throughout the year. Here's the breakdown of each new option:

For both plans, your actual energy use will continue to show on your bill and on our online usage graphs so you can still monitor the amount of electricity consumed monthly.

LEVELIZED BUDGET BILLING

'levels out' your monthly energy bill.



Levelized Budget Billing

- Based on a rolling average of your current and previous 11-month usage.
- Amount will fluctuate slightly from month-to-month.
- Makes your bills more predictable and consistent year-round.
- Average is recalculated every month.
- No BIG surprises in September.
- No refund check issued.

Fixed Budget Billing

- Pay the same amount for 12 months (October through September).
- Budget amount is set based on the 12-month average at your location.
- In September each year, your account is reviewed against your actual usage and will be recalculated.
- If you paid more than the energy amount used, your credit will be divided over the next 12 months bills.
- If you paid less than the energy amount used, your balance owed will be divided over the next 12 months bills.
- No refund check issued.

An attitude of gratitude

Did you know gratitude can make you happier?

It's not just a platitude. In a landmark 2003 study, psychologists Robert Emmons and Michael McCullough divided 201 college students into three groups and asked them to write weekly reflections. For 10 weeks, members of the first group recorded positive occurrences they were grateful for. The second group wrote about occurrences that made them annoyed or displeased. The third group simply wrote down neutral happenings.

Ten weeks later, the first group of students not only had a more positive outlook than the other two groups—they also exercised significantly more each week and experienced less illness. “Our results provide some important findings that have not been reported in the empirical literature on happiness,” the authors write. “There do appear to exist benefits to regularly focusing on one’s blessings.”

This Thanksgiving month, we have a lot to be grateful for at Kenergy. Working in the electric industry has changed the way I see many daily actions. Every time I plug in the coffee pot, take a picture on my phone, stream a show on the television or simply turn on the lights, I’m grateful for the forward-thinking leaders who connected our communities to electricity.

Even today, co-ops fulfill a mission that would look daunting to other kinds of utilities. Did you know that investor-owned utilities have an average of 35 customers per mile of line, whereas electric co-ops serve an average of just seven members per mile? Five directors to be elected in 2026

Prior to Kenergy's annual membership meeting on June 9, 2026, individuals will be elected to represent Districts 4, 6, 8 and 9, as well as the cooperative's large industrial members.

A ballot listing the qualified candidates in a contested district election will be mailed in May to each Kenergy member residing within the district. Members will also have the option to vote online.

District 4, which is currently represented by Susan Blanford, includes the area of Henderson County west of the Pennyrile Parkway and west of that portion of Highway 41 which runs to the north of the Pennyrile Parkway.

District 6, which is currently represented by Larry Elder, includes that area of Daviess County west of U.S. 431.

District 8, which is currently represented by Billy Reid, includes that area of Daviess County north and east of Kentucky 54.

District 9, which is currently represented by Brent Wigginton, includes all of Hancock County.

A district director must be a member of the cooperative and must reside in the district he or she represents.

The industrial director must be a member of Kenergy or the employee of a member industry having a

contract demand of at least 1,000 KW and must reside in a county all or a portion of which is located within Kenergy's service territory. Richard Basham is the current industrial director.

Any 15 or more members may make nominations of eligible persons for district director and any five or more large industrial members may make nominations of eligible persons for industrial director. Such nominations shall be by signed written petition and shall be submitted to the cooperative not less than 110 days prior to the annual meeting.

Only members eligible to vote in a district are authorized to sign a petition nominating a member from that district, and only those eligible to vote in an industrial director election are authorized to sign a petition nominating a person for industrial director. Directors shall be elected only from nominations by petition.

It is not a requirement to use a petition form prepared by Kenergy, however, anyone wishing to do so, may request one by contacting Debbie Hayden at (270) 689-6101 or dhayden@kenergycorp.com.

The petition must be submitted to the cooperative by 4 p.m. on February 19, 2026. Thereafter, if the petition is valid, the name of the nominee will be posted.

All Kenergy offices will be closed Thursday, November 27, and Friday, November 28, for the Thanksgiving holiday. We hope you enjoy the holiday with family and friends.
