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Safety Matters

Stay safe on the farm

Avoid hazards around water and electricity

s farmers gear up for an active summer across the commonwealth, Kenergy urges extra caution when operating irrigation equipment.

During the spring and summer, farmers often must use irrigation equipment to supplement rainfall, but water and electricity don't mix. That's why it's essential to use safe work practices.

Follow these tips to stay safe:

- PROPERLY SELECT AND IN-STALL EQUIPMENT. The system should be wired to the standards of the National Electrical Code: It must have disconnect switches; it must use equipment and enclosures suitable for conditions; it must protect wires from physical damage or use jacketed irrigation cable; and it must have circuit and equipment grounding.
- PERFORM ROUTINE MAIN-TENANCE CHECKS. Proactively look for faulty equipment and proper wiring installation.
- USE SAFE WORK PRACTICES.
 Turn off the power before working on an irrigation system. Be aware of overhead power lines when working





with irrigation pipes, when standing on systems and when spraying water near power lines. Avoid wearing loose clothing and tie back long hair when near rotating equipment.

 BEWARE OF DAMP ENVIRON-MENTS. Operating pumps and other equipment in damp environments increases the chance of equipment failure. Farmers who are rain-soaked and muddy are much more vulnerable to electric shock.

Farm work is rewarding, but it can be dangerous. Following these practices is an important way to stay safe during the busy summer season.

Sign-up for text alerts before outages happen

id you know that residential Kenergy members can text in outages and receive status reports when the lights are out?

To enroll, text the word KENERGY to 85700.

Enroll in our text alert system before you experience an outage. Our text alert system updates daily, so new enrollees can't use the program immediately upon sign-up. Enrolling before an outage guarantees the system will be available if you experience trouble with your electricity in the future.

Your current mobile phone number must be associated with your Kenergy account for the system to work correctly. If we don't have your mobile phone number on file, you will be prompted to call (800) 844-4832 during regular business hours to speak with a member service representative who can assist you with enrollment.

(This texting service is limited to residential members with four or fewer accounts.)

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Scholarship applications

now open

energy has established an annual scholarship program to assist in financing the higher education of students whose families are cooperative members. In 2024, Kenergy will award three \$1,000 scholarships and twenty-four \$500 scholarships. Applications will be accepted from June 1until June 30.

Scholarships can be used for tuition, fees, on-campus housing, text-books, computers, school supplies and other costs directly related to the recipient's education.



The student must be a Kenergy member or have his or her residence with a parent or legal guardian who receives electric service from Kenergy.

High school seniors or graduates may apply. High school juniors planning to attend an accredited college as a high school senior with full-time status in 2024–25 may also apply. Applicants must attend or have plans to attend college during the upcoming fall and/or spring semester. Applicants must be enrolled in a full-time program (no fewer than 12 credit hours) at a fully accredited college, university, technical college or trade school. Nine credit hours meets full-time requirement for master's



programs. Postgraduate college students also may apply. Nontraditional students are welcome as well.
